• **Social Studies 8** - The students have been diligently working on their cumulative projects, showcasing their understanding of the Aztecs before contact with the Spanish, the impact of the Spanish on the Aztecs, and the influence on Mexico today.

Looking ahead, our final unit will focus on Japan. The students will explore how Japan's geography shaped beliefs and values, the effects of the Edo period's isolation policy and Meiji period's cultural contact on Japanese identity, and the impact of Western cultures on the Japanese worldview. Additionally, they will examine the tensions that arise when a society adapts to rapid changes and how different cultures can learn to appreciate and benefit from one another.

• **ELA 8** - Students are finishing up their book club projects, which are due on Tuesday, April 8th. These projects are an excellent opportunity for them to demonstrate their deep understanding of the novel through critical thinking and analysis of characters, plot, conflict, theme, and mood.

Next week, we will transition to our last novel study of the year, *The Giver*. This shift from historical fiction to the dystopian genre will allow students to engage with many controversial topics, fostering critical thinking and analytical discussions as they defend their beliefs and values.
