● ELA 7 -

In their Grade 7 English Language Arts class, students are engaging with the iconic Canadian story "Anne of Green Gables" through a visual study of its film adaptation, which is divided into nine episodes. This approach allows students to immerse themselves in the story's rich themes and characters while journaling their thoughts and reflections. They are also completing comprehension questions that deepen their understanding of the narrative. Additionally, students will undertake small projects that relate to the film's content, enhancing their creative expression. At the end of this engaging unit, students will compile a portfolio that includes all their writing and project pieces, showcasing their journey through this beloved tale of imagination, resilience, and friendship.

- **Health 7** In the next month, we will be covering the following in Health 7. A Permission Click will be sent to all grade 7 parents before we talk about the following topics in our Health classes.
  - W-7.3 Examine the human reproductive process, and recognize misunderstandings associated with sexual development.
  - W-7.12 Identify the effects of social influences on sexuality and gender roles and equity; e.g., media, culture.
  - W-7.13 Examine the influences on personal decision making for responsible sexual behavior.
  - W-7.14 Examine abstinence and decisions to postpone sexual activity as healthy choices.
- Learning Strategies 7 Using agendas effectively is crucial for junior high students as they navigate their busy schedules filled with tests, projects, and assignments. In each Learning Strategies class, students are required to write down all upcoming activities, which not only helps them keep track of important dates but also enhances their time
